Early in my ministry journey, during a preaching seminar, a well-known preacher and colleague in our annual conference shared a story which brought back memories of worship experiences with which I am quite familiar having spent several years among Charismatic Christian communities. My colleague was invited to be the key-note speaker/preacher at a Pentecostal gathering. I can't remember the exact type of gathering, and that is not important. What is important is the context of the story and the freedom that God's Spirit brings in different expressions of Christian worship.

If I am remembering correctly, there was a sense of discomfort experienced by my colleague, likely the result of the unfamiliarity with Pentecostal worship. (I hope my memory is correct. If not, then I am overlaying my experience onto his ... forgiveness asked.) As he recalls, the service began with a time of prayer and praise. Prayer and praise in Charismatic/Pentecostal communities often involves vocal outward expressions of thanksgiving to and adoration of Jesus. This expression is not limited by time and can go own for a while. My colleague recalls the freedom with which the gathering allowed God to move among the crowd. Among the adorations and praise a gentleman sitting close by spoke of the beauty of Jesus, the beauty of Jesus' love. "Oh, Jesus, I love you. You are so beautiful to me." Over and over, this mantra/prayer was offered until the "Spirit lifted" and the service moved into another phase.

I don't remember what happened next. What I do remember thinking is the awe and reverence with which my colleague recalled the service and the deep reflection on the beauty of Jesus and his love he shared with us. He closed his recollection and took a seat at the piano and began to play *Fairest Lord Jesus*.

Some in the room knew the lyrics and began to sing and praise Jesus, and for a moment the Spirit of God "fell in that room" and a sense of awe and deep reverence came over us all. After a time, my colleague stopped playing, got up from his seat, said Amen and took a seat among us in the auditorium. The message given and received that worship, formal, informal and daily living is for thanksgiving for and adoration of Jesus.

The poem from which the hymn is taken was written by German composer Munster Gesangbuch in 1677. The last stanza reads:

Beautiful Savior! Lord of all the nations! Son of God and Son of Man! Glory and honor, Praise, adoration, now and forevermore be thine.


