A Moment From Mark

Psalm 96

- **1** Sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth.
- **2** Sing to the LORD, praise his name; proclaim his salvation day after day.
- 3 Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous deeds among all peoples.
- 4 For great is the LORD and most worthy of praise; he is to be feared above all gods.
- **5** For all the gods of the nations are idols, but the LORD made the heavens.
- **6** Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and glory are in his sanctuary.
- **7** Ascribe to the LORD, all you families of nations, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
- 8 Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering and come into his courts.
- **9** Worship the LORD in the splendor of his holiness; tremble before him, all the earth.
- **10** Say among the nations, "The LORD reigns." The world is firmly established, it cannot be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity.
- 11 Let the heavens rejoice, let the earth be glad; let the sea resound, and all that is in it.
- 12 Let the fields be jubilant, and everything in them; let all the trees of the forest sing for joy.
- 13 Let all creation rejoice before the LORD, for he comes, he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples in his faithfulness. (NIV Bible Translation)

Sometime around 1000 B.C., King David brought the Ark of the Covenant back to Jerusalem. And it is believed that David wrote Psalm 96 as a commemoration to this momentous occasion. Several themes run throughout the thirteen verse song or Psalm such as God's sovereignty, God's creation, how we should reject idolatry, a call for the people to worship, and the judgement to come. It also makes a great responsive reading for the church collectively. In addition, it also is a beautifully laid out sermon, complete with a nice outline.

Another way to look at this Psalm, however, is found in the first verse: "Sing to the LORD a new song." Besides celebrating the return of the Ark of the Covenant, David lays out not only the importance of collective worship, but David gives a call to worship, our reason for worship, the content of our worship, and the immanent coming of judgment. In fact, every Lord's Day is a call for celebration and remembrance of what Christ did for us on Calvary. In fact, every day is a call for celebration and remembrance of who is responsible for our Salvation, our eternal life.

At Fair Grove, we have embarked on a "new song." "The old has passed away, behold all things have become new."

Food- It seems to be a roller coaster with how much food we actually receive through the food bank. We continue to purchase quite a bit from Aldi. Walmart, dollar tree. If any of your groups, churches, businesses would like to collect some food items for us that would be a big help! Donations always seem to go down not only monetarily but also goods, in January and February. I pray that everyone will be mindful that the needs continue!

Shelter-We will open our women and children's homeless shelter on January 1 First, thank you guys for giving so that we could open the doors once again. There are some additional needs some basic expenses that need to be covered regarding food, hygiene, immediate needs of our guests and the shelter. In addition, on our Facebook page you will find a link to sign up to provide a meal one evening for 20 people. There's also a sign up asking you to volunteer four hour increment on a weekend so that we can keep the women and children inside on the weekends. During the week, they have school work, etc. and the bus picks them up In the morning but they really have nowhere to go on the weekend, and it's cold! We would like to be able to keep them Inside. Please volunteer so that we can do that.

We do have good news with a wonderful blessing from a business in our community that would like to remain anonymous. They provided the funds for us to be able to begin construction on a sleeping quarters for the shelter. As most of you know we are currently using our Chapel/multipurpose area for the sleeping quarters. It is challenging to share the space that's for sure, so we're looking forward to getting this construction underway! We are so thankful for God's provision on this! Be prayerful for this project, but everything would go quickly and efficiently with God's favor!




Introduction


