### A Moment with Pastor Mark

We've been studying in the book of Acts about how the church was formed and how it was so different from all the other religions of the day, including Judaism. And what made it so different was the basic ground roots differences between religion and Christianity. Religion began at the Tower of Babel where humanity tried to reach up to the gods to know them. Whereas, Christianity is not about man trying to reach up to know God but rather God reaching down to humanity that we might know God. After all, Christianity is literally "the way of Christ" or "Christ-likeness."

However, there is something even more important in Christianity that no other religion can boast. While Jesus has given us the example of how we should live, it is the Holy Spirit that lives inside of us through which we are inspired to live like Jesus. Do you understand that? Jesus literally lives inside of us! Yes we were created with a conscience, and that conscience is what guides us in the decisions and choices we make. Yet, our conscience can be controlled by good or evil. Our conscience, while it should be that which controls our thinking for the good, can be influenced in such a way that it begins to control for the bad.

We need to ask ourselves daily, do we have a Christ-centered Conscience? What is a Christ-centered Conscience? A Christ-centered conscience is one whereby we study the Scriptures in order to be more like Christ. But a Christ-centered conscience involves the leading of the Holy

Spirit. In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he says, "The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God." (1 Corinthians 2:10) The Holy Spirit searches the deep things of God, the deep things within the crevices of our minds, and the words of Scripture to map our journey in this life as we prepare for our life in eternity.

So let me close with these two verses from 1 Corinthians 2:11, 16.

"For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. . . for, "Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ."




